In the private sector I have represented clients in small claims, landlord-tenant, domestic, civil litigation, criminal litigation, traffic, estate planning, wrongful death, real estate, contract and federal criminal matters. I have completed 40 hours of Family Court Mediation training. I am a certified arbitrator and mediator with the Better Business Bureau.

As a judge I have the respect of my peers as an ethical and fair jurist. I have presided over hundreds of cases in my 17 years as a Municipal Judge.
