

**IN THE 37TH CIRCUIT COURT FOR THE
STATE OF MISSOURI**

In Re: COVID-19

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention have declared that the outbreak of COVID-19 is a worldwide pandemic, and both the President of the United States and the Governor of Missouri have declared a state of emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Missouri Supreme Court has issued its order to the Courts of Missouri suspending in-person proceedings subject only to certain exceptions delineated in such orders from March 17, 2020, until April 3, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Missouri Supreme Court has restricted or denied access to the Courthouse by certain persons.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that effective immediately and until further order of the Court, that the following persons shall not enter the Howell, Oregon, Shannon or Carter County Courthouses, to the Judvenile Office of the 37th Circuit:


- Persons who have traveled to any foreign county within the last 14 days;
- Persons who reside or have had close contact with someone who has traveled to any foreign country within the last 14 days;
- Persons who have been asked to self-quarantine by any doctor, hospital or health agency;
- Persons who have tested positive, been diagnosed with, or have had contact with, anyone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19; and
- Persons with fevers, or unexplained coughs or shortness of breath.

Anyone attempting to enter in violation of these protocols will be denied entry and removed from the Courthouse by Court Security.

Any attorney or party shall immediately notify opposing counsel and the court if they reasonably suspect that a participant in any proceeding authorized by this Court's Administrative Order may come within any of the above listed categories.

Further notice of said restriction shall be placed conspicuously on the door of each such courthouse or facility.
