Growing up in the city of Saint Louis, becoming a lawyer or a judge was not on my radar. There were no lawyers in my family or close family friends that were lawyers. As a young person my knowledge of lawyers stemmed only from watching LA Law with my mom and brother. They would tell you that my interest in the law and my inquisitive nature started then. Knowing that the schools in my neighborhood would not provide me with the best opportunities, my mom put me into the desegregation program and I was bussed to Saint Louis County for school. I didn't know any other students. I wasn't a friend from the neighborhood. I was an outsider. And at the end of every school day, I boarded a bus and went back to the city. I worked hard to build lifelong friendships with my classmates, become involved in my school, and gain the respect of teachers and staff. The challenge of an unknown environment was something I embraced and I learned how to engage with others. How to find common bonds when they weren't apparent. How to ask questions, listen, and be genuinely interested in others and sharing my personal experiences.

I carried those skills with me when I attended Boston University. Again, I knew no one in Boston. I boarded a plane by myself and set off on a new adventure. I quickly became a part of the Boston community through multiple community service activities and became even more exposed to different cultures and the unique struggles that those communities face. My passion for people was made stronger through this and gave me the confidence to board a ship of 450 students to travel around the world through Semester at Sea. This global experience solidified my desire to give back to my community and return to Saint Louis.

I have devoted my legal career to public service and I am very proud of the work I have done. I have placed myself in unique environments where I must be confident and humble every day, two qualities that don't often overlap. As a public defender in rural Missouri, I had to be at the top of my game every day. I wasn't automatically accepted as part of the community and I knew that if my work was mediocre, I would never be accepted. I put in the time to show my clients that I knew the law and had their best interest at heart. I learned about my clients as people, not just defendants and I learned about the community. As an Assistant County Counselor, I took the responsibility of representing the citizens of Saint Louis County seriously. As a municipal prosecutor, I was acutely aware that my interactions in the courtroom with the victims, witnesses and defendants were often their first encounter with the criminal justice system. As such, I believed it was imperative that I take the time to listen, explain the process and be available to victims and witnesses. In my current employment, I wear many hats within the course of a day, or even an hour. Being in the courtroom multiple times a week advocating for my client's means that I must adapt to my audiences to be successful. My clients, judges, prosecutors, court personnel, jurors, victims, law enforcement and others all require me to utilize different skills in our interactions.

I have a great respect for the law and an equally great respect for the members of our community. Being a judge is about more than the law, it is also about people. I find

the law to be intriguing, challenging and rewarding. I feel the same way about people. I am fortunate to speak with residents of this community every single day and I help them navigate a system that is filled with barriers. As Circuit Judge, I would be honored to continue to help the community of Saint Louis County.

Beverly Hauber was born and raised in the Saint Louis area. She received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Boston University in 2004. As an undergraduate student, she also participated in a nine-country study abroad program through Semester at Sea.
